Starved Rock and Matthiessen State Park Site Visit

In early July, the IDNR legislative team visited Starved Rock and Matthiessen State Park with Leader Castro, and her staff, and Representative Yednock. The wonderful park staff taught us history of the lands and showed us the beautiful features – such as natural cliff faces and waterfalls. These two state parks offer some of the most stunning nature that Illinois has to offer and draws visitors from all over the world. Historic Site Highlight: Douglas Tomb – Downtown Chicago



This site offers a scenic park south of downtown and is the burial place of distinguished statesman Stephen Arnold Douglas (1813-1861). Visitors are able to see the towering monument that portrays an important part of Illinois history to remember.

State Park Highlight: Illinois Caverns State Natural Area - Waterloo

Which more than 9.6km of passages, Illinois Caverns in the second-largest cave in Illinois. Visitors can explore the depths of the state that many never know exist. For those who have never explored caves, they are quiet, cool in temperature, and give breadth to just how cool nature is. Explorers can see stalactites, stalagmites, rimstone dams, flowstone, and soda straws. Additionally, there is an underground stream that meanders through the cave's enriched bed. Cave-adapted animals, such as bats and salamanders, can be spotted as well. It's quite literally a cool, hidden-feature of Illinois that is worth exploring.
